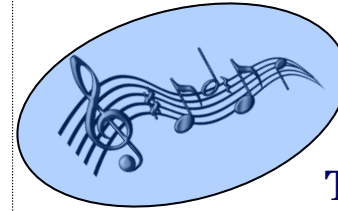

Violin

Ms. Jan High is a certified violin instructor and plays with the Merrimack Valley Symphony Orchestra. Children, ages 6 to 12



learn to play the violin using the Suzuki teaching method. Instruments are rented from Trinity Church. Lessons are most often in group settings to encourage children to learn together. Recital opportunities are offered two times during the program year,

Flute / Recorder :

Pastor Mellissa Yosua Davis teaches flute and recorder. She has been playing the flute since the 5th grade and has performance experience both in high school in an award winning jazz ensemble and with the orchestra at Colby College. Children in grades 1 to 4 receive instruction on the recorder, Grades 5 and up may receive instruction on the flute.



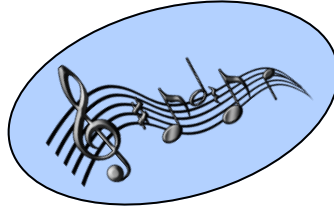
Piano Instructor:



At the present time A.C.A.T. has not identified our piano instructor. It is our hope to participate with local schools and find a student instructor. Piano instruction is one on one and is offered to children ages 6 to 12. More information will be available before the start of our first session.

Drama

Ms. Nancy Morrissey directs our dramatic productions. Ms Morrissey is gifted in set and costume design and creation and has been directing artistic productions for several years. Last year she and her A.C.A.T. troupe presented The Fire Bird at our final recital. Children might be called upon to help make the sets and create the costumes as well as work stagehands, actors, and singers in the chorus.

Guitar Instructor:

Mr. Richard Mungo has over 40 years playing and teaching guitar. He currently plays with the Assabet Ramblers.



Guitar students may rent their instruments from Trinity. Classes are most often in a group setting. Guitar is offered to our older children as younger hands may not be

large enough to play the instrument. Children interested in guitar should speak to one of the mentors about instrument choice.

Joyful Noise Chorus



Choir members will learn the rudiments of reading music, breath support and healthy vocal techniques appropriate for young ages.

Boomwhackers are simple plastic tubes which are tuned and color coded. They can be used as percussion or melody instruments. Everyone loves them and they are appropriate for all ages 3 to 90. They are a great introduction to music and can be combined with singing and dancing. Other percussion instruments will be used from time to time and some instrument students may be able to accompany the chorus at recitals.
